



## Directions for Matching Game – Schools for Africa

1. Angola  
An island nation...contrary to the Disney vision of Madagascar, there are no penguins on the island.
2. Burkina Faso  
Located in southeastern Africa bordered by the Indian Ocean, Tanzania, and other countries. One of the most poverty-stricken and under developed countries in the world.
3. Ethiopia  
Located in West Africa, bordering the North Atlantic Ocean, between Guinea and Senegal. Known for children to be subjected to forced labor and sex trafficking.
4. Guinea-Bissau  
Found at the southern tip of the African continent. It ranks fifth in the world in unemployed youth aged 15-24.
5. Zimbabwe  
In Western Africa bordering the North Atlantic Ocean, between Guinea and Liberia. Infant mortality rate – 11<sup>th</sup> in the world.
6. Madagascar  
In Southern Africa, with the Atlantic Ocean on the west. Early childhood education covers less than 10% of children
7. Malawi  
East Africa, landlocked, surrounded by five countries. One of the few African countries to have its own alphabet.
8. Mali  
A West African landlocked country with most of its area in the Sahara. Its population has tripled in 50 years and is projected to triple again in the next 50 years.
9. Mozambique  
Located two degrees south of the equator, slightly smaller than the state of Maryland.
10. Niger  
In West Africa, landlocked with Mali to the north. Literacy rate one of lowest in world.
11. South Africa  
Landlocked in Southeastern Africa with more than 1/2 of the population living below the poverty line; average yearly income is \$280.00
12. Rwanda  
Landlocked by seven countries in West Africa, southeast of Algeria. It has the highest fertility rate in the world, 7.03 births per woman with nearly half (49%) of the population being under age 15.
13. Sierra Leone  
Landlocked in Southern African country surrounded by Zambia, etc. 86.5% of the population can read and write English.

7. Malawi **(3-Ethiopia)** East Africa, landlocked, surrounded by five countries. One of the few African countries to have its own alphabet.
8. Mali **(8- Mali)** A West African landlocked country with most of its area in the Sahara. Its population has tripled in 50 years and is projected to triple again in the next 50 years.
9. Mozambique **(12- Rwanda)** Located two degrees south of the equator, slightly smaller than the state of Maryland.
